HOMES

If you have a spare room and are happy for one or more Ukrainians to share your home (or a property you own) for at least six months do sign up to www.gov.uk 'Homes for Ukraine' scheme and RESET www.resetuk.org. NB Using trusted matching schemes seems to speed things up. Do ask around in your area for more information. See page 5

EUROSTAR & FLIGHTS TO UK

Eurostar are offering free tickets from their continental destinations to London for those with a Ukrainian passport. Some airlines are also offering free flights and Stansted is offering free parking to those picking up Ukrainian guests (use the 'green' car park and explain at the barrier).



UK TRAINS

Ukrainian guests arriving in the country will be eligible for a single onward journey via national rail, bus, light rail and coach free of charge to anywhere in England. Visit www.nationalrail.co.uk for more details.

BENEFITS

Hosts: When your guests arrive please email refugeesupport@suffolk.gov.uk and give your name, address and the names of your guests.

BANKS

To receive Universal Credit and other benefits your guests will need to open a bank account by visiting any bank. HSBC and Monzo have been particularly recommended by support groups thus far, though most banks say they will welcome new Ukrainian customers.



SCHOOLS

The education of children and young people and the supportive community offered by schools will be vital to Ukrainian families. PETS

The government are offering a streamlined system covering the costs of any necessary stays in quarantine for the pets of those fleeing Ukraine. Go to www.gov.uk and search 'Ukraine' and 'Pets' will appear.



DOCTORS & DENTISTS

Ukrainian nationals can register with both doctors and dentists. Doctors: contact your local surgery; Dentist: Guests can register as either a NHS patient or a private patient (find a dentist at www.nhs.uk/service-search/find-a-dentist)



TRANSPORT

www.communities.suffolkonboard.com/about is designed to help people travel around Suffolk who might not have access to a regular bus service. Negotiations regarding reduced-price bus passes are ongoing.



SIM CARDS

Free Vodafone SIM cards for Ukrainians are available from Suffolk Refugee Services 01473 400785 or from the Red Cross with unlimited free UK calls for 6 months and 20GB of data plus £50 gift card (from the Red Cross).

EE, Three, Virgin Media 02 & BT are also offering schemes. Best for hosts to organise these before guests arrive as these will be key.

COVID

Ukrainian nationals can get the Covid-19 vaccine and boosters for free through the NHS, once registered with a GP. These can happen at surgeries, walk-in clinics and via a bookable service (0344 2573961). Specialist support is available if needed.



WHEELCHAIRS

The Red Cross hires out equipment for short-term use. The service is free to Ukrainian refugees.
